GENERAL INFORMATION

The only access drive to Copped Hall is via the white gates on Crown Hill (Upshire Road). The gates are the first turning on the right from the B1393 and they will be staffed when Copped Hall is open. **The lodges are privately owned and it is essential not to disturb the lodge owners for access. The postcode for entry by Satnav is CM16 5HR.**

Friends of the Copped Hall Trust, children under 16 years and necessary carers have free entry for Guided Tours, Garden Afternoons (including Easter Sunday), Open Days and Apple Day. On these occasions dogs are welcome but must be kept on leads. Dogs, other than assistance dogs, are not permitted in the mansion or Racquets Court at all. **There is no need to book for the above events.**

GUIDED TOURS AND OPEN DAYS 2018

MONTHLY GUIDED TOURS

Sundays: 21 January, 18 February, 18 March, 15 April, 20 May, 17 June, *15 July, 19 August, 16 September, 21 October, 18 November.

Entry £8.00 per person.

Guided tours take place on the third Sunday of every month except December. Tours start at 10.00am and last about 2½-3 hours. They cover the whole of the gardens, a large part of the mansion, the cellars and the stables. Gates will be open from 10.00am with last entry at 11.00am.

Tea, coffee and home-made cakes are available in the Racquets Court where there is also a shop selling books about Copped Hall and a range of gift items. Second hand books are on sale in the mansion. There are also permanent exhibitions on site. At most times of the year we sell seasonal fruit and vegetables from our Walled Kitchen Garden.

*** In 2018 there will be an extended Guided Tour day on 15 July. Gates will be open from 10.00am with last entry at 1.00pm.** Tours will be in three parts (downstairs, upstairs and gardens) and visitors will be free to choose which and how many they wish to do. Tours will leave at 15-minute intervals; each one will last around 1 hour. Light refreshments will be available until 2.00pm.

GARDEN AFTERNOONS

Sundays: 1 April, 6 May, 3 June, 1 July, 5 August and 2 September 2018.

Entry £5.00 per person.

Gates are open from 2.00pm with last entry at 4.00pm. The car park closes at 5.00pm and is locked at 5.15pm. Garden Afternoons provide an opportunity to wander round at leisure and talk to our gardeners. A map with brief descriptions of the gardens is given out on arrival. Refreshments are available in the Racquets Court until 4.00pm. The Trust shop will be open at the same times.

OPEN DAYS

Sundays 27 May and 26 August 2018 11.00am-4.00pm.

Entry £10.00 per person.

There will be access to the whole of the gardens, parts of the mansion (with room stewards present), the cellars and the stables. Tea, coffee, home-made cakes and lunch are available, as well as a bar selling alcoholic drinks. There are stalls and exhibitions, home-made and home-grown produce for sale, and the Trust shop will be open.

APPLE DAY

Sunday 14 October 2018. Gates open 11.00am-4.00pm.

Entry £10.00 per person.

Access to both gardens and mansion (room stewards) as for open days. Apple Day is a national annual celebration of our apple orchards and local distinctiveness. Join in the fun, play some traditional games, help with the juicing and have your own apples identified by our expert. There will be a display and apples for sale. There will also be entertainment, refreshments and bar, lunches, produce for sale and the Trust shop.

EASTER EGG HUNT

Easter Sunday 1 April 2018. Gates open 2.00pm-4.00pm.

Entry £5.00 per person. Egg hunt: 50p per child taking part

The car park will be closed at 5.00pm and locked at 5.15pm. Children can see the Easter bunny and join in an Easter egg hunt while adults enjoy the spring flowers. There will be tea/coffee and home-made cakes available until 4.00pm and the gift shop will be open until the same time.

PRIVATE GROUPS FOR TOURS

Alan Cox- THE LAST YEAR AT COPPED HALL

Gates open at 2.30pm for 3.00pm start.

Alan Cox is a co-founder of the Copped Hall Trust and its chairman and architect. He will give an illustrated overview of the achievements at Copped Hall during the last year, covering the mansion, gardens and events.

Sunday 8 April 2018

Amy Burt - AN INTRODUCTION TO GOLDWORK

9.30am for 10am start, finishing at 4pm.

This introduction to goldwork embroidery day class in the design of Ancient Egyptian Queen Nefertiti, will teach you the basic goldwork techniques using metallic threads and materials. You will learn chipping with 'bright check', areas of cutwork and how to use pearl purl. Amy is an embroidery tutor for the Royal School of Needlework, she trained for 3 years at the RSN School in Hampton Court Palace. As well as teaching, she embroiders for the London based haute couture fashion house Ralph and Russo. You will be provided with a kit containing the embroidery design on fabric, with threads, materials and needles included as well as an information sheet with design plan and stitch instructions. Embroidery hoops and scissors will be provided for the day or bring your own sewing kit and hoop if desired.

Other dates will be arranged throughout the year.

9.30am for a 10am start, finishing at 4pm.

This workshop will take you inside working beehives to discover the world of the honeybee and its management, demonstrate equipment required by a bee-keeper, and give an overview of the bee-keeping year. The day will end with extraction of honey from the hive.

Please wear long-sleeved clothing, trousers and Wellington or sturdy boots. Do not wear perfume, drink alcohol, eat bananas or work with animals prior to attending. Protective bee-keeping clothing will be supplied. This event is weather dependent and if it is postponed, an alternative day will be offered.

Tuesday 12 June 2018

William Tyler- PUBLIC & PRIVATE LIFE IN THE VICTORIAN COUNTRY HOUSE

10.00am for 10.30am start.

Following last year's look at Georgian Country Houses, this year we look at Victorian. The Victorian age was the age of Britain's supremacy in the world, and the life of those 'upstairs' in its country houses reflected this. Life, however, was very different for those 'below stairs'. We shall look at many aspects of life in the country houses of this period, from grand entertaining to furnishings, from poaching on the estate to outdoor pursuits, from indoor gardening to cooking.

Wednesday 15, Saturdays 11 and 18 August 2018.

Peter Warne- CLOSE-UP & MACRO PHOTOGRAPHY COURSE

The gates will be open from 9am for a 9.30am start, finishing at 4pm.

The course is designed for a maximum of 10 participants with the aim of teaching how to take pictures in close-up to reveal detail often invisible to the naked eye. This type of photography poses several technical challenges and Peter will work through each of these both by an introductory talk and then by practical demonstration. In the morning session he will provide a number of subjects - flowers from the gardens, lichen from tree bark and a selection of carnivorous plants - which will be set up for photography within the mansion. Peter is often able to provide a few surprise items as well such as snakes' skins, fungi and insects. The delegates can either work alone or as a group to investigate the best focus methods and lighting techniques. In the afternoon, after a lunch of soup with bread followed by cakes, the group will, weather willing, move to the Walled Garden to try its hand at photographing moving subjects such as dragonflies and butterflies.

Wednesday 25 July 2018

MUSIC WORKSHOP run by ARBUTUS MUSIC: THE GONDOLIERS

The Gondoliers, or, "The King of Barataria" was Gilbert & Sullivan's 12th Savoy Operetta, opening in December 1889 and running for 554 performances. The plot is the usual mixture of confusion and chaos. The young bride of the heir to the throne of Barataria arrives in Venice to join her betrothed. However, it turns out that at birth he was entrusted to a drunken gondolier, who mixed up the prince with his own son. So, the two young gondoliers must jointly rule the Kingdom until the nurse of the prince can determine which is the rightful king. It was the last of G&S's great successes and contains one of their most loved songs "Take a Pair of Sparkling Eyes".

As always Christine Gwynn and Frances Quintrell of Arbutus Music will be our guides on our journey through this music.

Michael Goater -ANTIQUE FURNITURE RESTORATION

During this practical two-day course you will learn the techniques essential for repairing and re-finishing antique furniture. Bring your own furniture to work on. You will discover what you can and should not do to preserve it in an attractive and functional condition. If you do not complete the restoration during the course, you will know how to do so and for a limited period further advice will be available by phone should you need it. Materials and some tools will be provided although it is advisable to bring any that you have or can borrow. There will be instructions on how to use, adjust and sharpen woodworking tools. Your tutor is an experienced restorer and lecturer, and is an accredited member and former chairman of the British Antique Furniture Restorers' Association.

Did you know that in our Solar System we have over 170 moons? We are all familiar with seeing Earth's Moon in the night sky but what do the moons of Jupiter and Saturn look like? What secrets do they hold? Why are they all so different? Is there the possibility that life has or could exist on one of these moons? Is there evidence of water? Find the answers as we take a visual trip around our Solar System with stunning images of the planets and moons. During the day we will also review recent discoveries and space exploration to the far reaches of our Universe.

Tuesday 23 October 2018

**THE SOCIETY FOR THE PROTECTION OF ANCIENT BUILDINGS:
ITS CAUSE, HISTORY AND WORK TODAY**

10.00 am for 10.30 am start.

The Society for the Protection of Ancient Buildings is the largest, oldest and most technically expert charity fighting across the UK to save old buildings from decay, demolition and damage. Formed by the designer and polymath William Morris in 1877, it has shaped the approach to building conservation not only in this country but much further afield too, and its unique philosophy is as relevant today as it has ever been. Our Study Day on the 'grandfather' of the British building conservation movement will be led by Douglas Kent, the Society's Technical and Research Director.

The course will comprise four illustrated talks relating to the SPAB. We will hear first about the origins of this venerable Society - which was set up to counter the destructive restorations of the Victorian era - and its approach the care and repair of old buildings. In the second talk, we will learn about the SPAB's activities today, including its casework, education and training role, technical remit, Mills Section and Regional Groups. After lunch, Douglas will explain the SPAB's technical work in more detail, ranging from its advice on how to control dampness in old buildings to the latest research on improving the energy efficiency of old buildings. The day will close with a case study of Douglas' own award-winning, SPAB-inspired project on his 14th-century Grade I-listed house in Essex, which was coincidentally once owned by the Society.

ARCHAEOLOGY

Copped Hall Trust Archaeological Project (CHTAP) - 2018

CHTAP will be running its usual series of taster weekends and field schools at Copped Hall, which is an important archaeological site with a complex sequence of building phases. Its recorded history starts in the 12th century. They will take place on the site of the earlier mansion, 'Old' Copped Hall, which stood at the northern end of the gardens and was demolished in 1748. The site is mainly Tudor, but previous archaeological finds have dated from the prehistoric all the way to modern times.

The three taster weekends in July will be open to all, including complete beginners, and are designed to teach the absolute basics of archaeology and excavation. In **August** a five-day field school will be held for those who have already learnt the basics of excavation and recording and wish to develop their skills further. The aim of the schools will be to advance the archaeology of old Copped Hall.


